Interactive Site Reports – Prompting Questions

We have prepared some prompting questions for you to help frame your panel presentation. You do not need to answer all of these – they are only suggestions. The theme of the Summit is Building Equity, Access and Impact, should you want to speak to it:

- *Briefly* describe your program:
 - Where is your program located?
 - What is your program model (problem-solving court, intensive supervision probation with services, other)?
 - Who do you serve in your program?
 - Any particular treatment focus (e.g., drug treatment, mental health treatment, veterans, other)?
 - Any eligibility limitations (e.g., residency, offense)?
 - How many participants are currently enrolled in your program?
- How do you know your program is achieving its goals and improving participants' lives?
 - How do you gather and act on participants' input (Vital Voices)?
 - What measures do you look at beyond reducing prison admissions and recidivism?
 - Do you have examples of how you use quantitative and qualitative data in decision-making?
- What are your program's **strengths**?
 - What is currently working well for you?
 - What is your favorite part of what you offer – the best thing you've got?
 - Do any community partnerships help improve your participants' outcomes?
 - How are you using ARI funding innovatively to meet the needs of your participants?
- What are your biggest **challenges**?
 - What are the largest barriers to participants' completion of your ARI program?
 - What resources or services do you wish your participants could access that are not currently available?
- For multi-year grantees – how have you **adapted**?
 - Has your program model or service population changed since you launched your program? If so, what's changed & why?
 - Have your treatment options or services changed since you launched your program? If so, what's changed & why?
 - Has COVID-19 changed your program? What lessons have been learned due to the pandemic?
