

LaSalle County Adult Redeploy Intensive Probation Program

The goal of this grant program is to reduce the number of non-violent offenders committed to the Illinois Department of Corrections. It provides a greater level of supervision for this high risk and high need client population within our community while maintaining community safety.

Enhancing treatment services based on each client's individual needs. The case load for this program can accept up to 40 clients. Each Intensive Probation Officer can supervise a case load up to 20 clients. Smaller caseloads allow for increased contacts.

Eligibility

- Resident of LaSalle County
- Non-violent offenders with 1, 2, 3, and 4 Class Felonies.
- Clients with violent offenses will be considered by Program Staff on a case by case basis.
- Not on Parole
- Moderate/High Risk per the validated Illinois Adult Risk Assessment (completed by Probation)

This program model is an Intensive Probation Supervision with additional services as deemed appropriate by Supervising Intensive Probation Officers utilizing the following through North Central Behavioral Health Services:

- Drug testing
- Collateral contacts
- Medication Assistance Therapy (MAT), Individual/Group Counseling, Mental Health
- 12 step groups, Cognitive Behavioral Therapy (CBT), Moral Reconciliation Therapy (MRT)
- Education and employment assistance
- Mandate treatment
- Develop community service program and site

These services are evidenced-based practices that addresses the probationer's risks and needs. Intensive Probation Officers at times go to the group sessions in order to observe their clients progress. The Intensive Probation Officers remove barriers and assist this clientele to be successful. Officers transport individuals to detox/inpatient facilities when needed.

Sanctions are used when clients violate the terms of their conditions, the supervising Intensive Probation Officers use administrative sanctions that could include, but not limited to; more frequent drug testing; more frequent meetings with probation; electronic monitoring, homebound detainment, writing assignments etc. The Intensive Probation Officer will exhaust all avenues prior to recommending a Petition to Revoke.
